### ORDER:

In the Government Order third read above, a sum of Rs.182.00 lakhs was sanctioned under Hill Area Development Programme for implementing various Horticulture Development Schemes in the Nilgiris District during 2008-2009. In the letter fourth read above, the Project Director, Hill area Development Programme has sent proposals of Rs.227.00 lakhs for implementation of schemes in both the selected and other water sheds areas and requested the Government to sanction the expenditure during 2009-2010 under Hill Area Development Programme. The Union Planning Commission, Government of India has approved an outlay of Rs.227.00 lakhs for Horticulture sector under Hill Area Development Programme during 2009-2010.

- 2. The Government, after careful consideration, accept the proposal of the Project Director, Hill Area Development Programme and accord sanction for incurring an expenditure of Rs.222.86 lakhs (Rupees two hundred and twenty two lakhs and eighty six thousand only) for implementation of various Horticulture Development schemes during 2009-2010, under Hill Area Development Programme, as detailed in the Annexure to this order. Orders regarding the schemes of protection of Marshy Land at a cost of Rs.4.14 lakhs (Rupees four lakhs and fourteen thousand only) will be issued separately.
- 3. The expenditure shall be debited to the head of account "2551 Hill Areas 60 Other Hill Areas 101 Crop Husbandry Schemes in the Eleventh five Year Plan II State Plan KG Schemes for the Development of Plantation Crops under Hill Area Development Programme 69 Procurement of Agricultural Inputs" (DPC No.2551 60 101 KG 6908).

- 4. A sum of Rs.182.00 lakhs has been provided in B.E. 2009-2010 under the above head of account. Necessary additional funds of Rs.40.86 lakhs will be provided in Re/FMA 2009-2010. Pending provision of funds in RE/FMA 2009-2010, the Collector of Nilgiris is authorised to draw the amount sanctioned in para 2 above and to deposit it in the Savings Bank Account of District Rural Development Agency and to disburse the same to the implementing agencies by means of cheques in favour of contractors and suppliers etc., based on the request from the Director of Horticulture and Plantation Crops subject to overall sanction of Rs.227.00 lakhs. Whenever cash is required for settlement of petty claims, the District Collector shall maintain detailed cash accounts in this regard and to get them reconciled on a monthly basis, as per the revised guidelines issued in the
- 5. The Project Director, Hill Area Development Programme and the Director of Horticulture and Plantation Crops, Chennai-5 are requested to include the above expenditure in the proposal for RE/FMA 2009-2010 while sending it to Finance Department at the appropriate time.
- 6. In order to promote sustainable Horticulture development under Hill Area Development Programme, the Project Director, Hill Area Development Programme is requested to ensure that the schemes are implemented on watershed basis as sanctioned in para 2 above and also the Horticulture schemes shall be implemented through Farmers Council to be formed in the current year. The orders on formation of farmers Council will be issued separately by the Government. The Project Director, Hill Area Development Programme shall ascertain that the amount allocated for the benefit of SC/STs as indicated in the Annexure to this order is spent exclusively for these groups and also to, ensure that the maximum subsidy applicable be restricted to 25% (Twenty five-percent only).
- 7. As envisaged in Government Order third read above, the Government direct the Project Director, Hill Area Development Programme Udhagamandalam to credit the receipts on account of sale proceeds on supply of clones of Tea, Silver Oak, fruits and spices, plants and other economic tree seedlings, supply of fertilizers and plant protection chemicals under the following receipt head of account viz. '0551 Hill Areas 60 Other Hill Areas 101 Crop Husbandry AD. Horticulture Receipt under Hill Area Development Programme" (0505) (DPC No.0551 60 101 AD 0008).
- 8. It shall be ensured that detailed estimates with Project Report are available for each item of work prior to disbursement and a copy submitted to the Collector of the concerned district in advance for monitoring. Where relevant, a baseline survey, user needs and beneficiary identification along with relevant details of watershed features, land use and likely (projected) impacts should form part of the project report so submitted. In cases where works are dependent on site selection with public participation, the details with photographic evidence and supporting remote sensing maps should be provided in the Project report. Finally, upon completion of the project, a completion report with photographs and factual report of use, impact, and beneficiary feed back should be sent along with financial details of utilization and balance surrendered including for works accounted under Letter of Credit method. In the case of beneficiaries of inputs, Plant Protection Equipment or other equipment, a certificate shall also be provided that the beneficiary has not received this benefit during the previous years and is therefore, eligible for the incentive to adopt technology.
- 9. The Project Director, Hill Area Development Programme, Udhagamandalam and the Director of Horticulture and Plantation Crops, Chennai-5 are requested to send progress report on the Horticulture schemes sanctioned in para 2 above by the 15<sup>th</sup> of

every month without fail and ensure that the allocation for schemes benefiting SC/ST people should be proportionate to their population and other conditions stipulated in the Union Planning Commission letter fifth read above.

- 10. The Agricultural Production Commissioner and Secretary to Government, Agriculture Department is requested to watch the implementation of the above schemes, as envisaged in the Government Order first read above.
- 11. This order issues with the concurrence of the Finance Department vide its U.O. No.58740/Agri/09, Dated 15.10.2009 and Additional Sanction Ledger No.896 (Eight hundred and ninety six).
