Agriculture & Farmers' Welfare - Implementation of Revamped Pradhan Mantri Fasal Bima Yojana (RPMFBY) during Kharif, Rabi & Special Seasons of 2021-2022 by adopting Co-Insurance model on 80:20 proportionate sharing basis — Tender finalized - Approval of Actuarial Premium Rates and Permission to issue work order to the selected Insurance Companies — Administrative Sanction - Accorded — Orders — Issued.

#### ORDER:

The Government of India communicated the policy changes and requested the States to implement Revamped Pradhan Mantri Fasal Bima Yojana from Kharif 2020 onwards. However, in response to the request made by the State Government, the Government of India permitted the Government of Tamil Nadu to implement Revamped Pradhan Mantri Fasal Bima Yojana adopting existing premium rates for Kharif 2020 alone and negotiate with the existing Insurance Companies or invite fresh bid from Rabi 2020-2021 onwards.

2. In the Government Order first read above, the Government have accorded administrative approval for implementation of Revamped Pradhan Mantri Fasal Bima Yojana in all the districts of Tamil Nadu except Chennai from Kharif 2020 season as per the Government of India guidelines (revised).

- 3. In the Government Order second read above, the Government have directed to implement the Revamped Pradhan Mantri Fasal Bima Yojana in all the districts of Tamil Nadu except Chennai during Special season (Samba) and Rabi season 2020-2021 by adopting new Co-Insurance Model on 80:20 proportionate sharing basis as permitted by the Government of India subject to the conditions mentioned in their letter dated 30.09.2020.
- 4. In the Government Order third read above, the Government approved the Cluster-wise Implementing Agencies for implementation of Revamped Pradhan Mantri Fasal Bima Yojana (RPMFBY) during Special and Rabi season 2020-21 in all the districts of Tamil Nadu except Chennai and issued notification of Agricultural & Horticultural Crops, Districts, Insurance Units and also Actuarial Premium Rate.
- 5. As the tender contractual period (Rabi season, 2020-2021) for implementation of Revamped Pradhan Mantri Fasal Bima Yojana with the empanelled Insurance Companies of Government of India ended by March, 2021, in G.O. fourth read above, orders were issued permitting the Director of Agriculture to call for a short tender of 15 days instead of 30 days as per Rule No.20 (2) of Chapter V of Tamil Nadu Transparency in Tender Rules, 2000 for selection of Insurance Companies for implementation of Revamped Pradhan Mantri Fasal Bima Yojana (RPMFBY) for a period of 3 years commencing from 2021-2022 to 2023-2024 in all the districts of Tamil Nadu except Chennai.
- 6. Subsequently, the Director of Agriculture in his letter 21.05.2021, has sent the proposal to Government for approval of the Actuarial Premium Rates quoted by the selected Insurance Companies and permission to issue work orders to L1 Insurance Companies for the e-bids opened on 10.05.2021.
- 7. In the Government Order fifth read above, the Government directed the Director of Agriculture to cancel the bids already called for implementation of Revamped Pradhan Mantri Fasal Bima Yojana (RPMFBY) from 2021-22 to 2023-24 and call for retender based on reorganized clustering, since the Actuarial Premium Rates quoted by the Insurance Companies were very high. The Government also permitted the Director of Agriculture to call for a short tender of 7 days instead of 30 days as per Rule No.20 (2) of Chapter-V of Tamil Nadu Transparency in Tender Rules, 2000 for selection of Insurance Companies for implementation of Revamped Pradhan Mantri Fasal Bima Yojana for a period of 3 years commencing from 2021-2022 to 2023-2024 in all the districts of Tamil Nadu except Chennai.
- 8. Further the Government of India in their letter sixth read above, has also conveyed that in this case since retender is necessitated because of inadequate participation and higher Actuarial Premium Rates (APR) quoted by the Insurance Companies, the State Government may proceed with retendering for Revamped Pradhan Mantri Fasal Bima Yojana (RPMFBY) for the period 2021-22 to 2023-24.
- 9. Subsequently, the Director of Agriculture in his letter 29.07.2021, has sent the proposal to Government for approval of the APRs quoted by the selected Insurance Companies and permission to issue work orders to L1 Insurance Companies for the e-bids opened on 12.07.2021.
- 10. Meanwhile as per the advice of Finance Department, Government in the D.O. letter seventh cited, addressed Government of India seeking permission to obtain revised Actuarial Premium Rates from the L1 bidders for implementing Revamped Pradhan Mantri Fasal Bima Yojana (RPMFBY) by adopting either of the

coinsurance models of 80:20 or 60:40 based on the fair revised premium rates furnished by the L1 bidders.

- 11. In the letter eight cited, the Government of India has permitted the State Government to invite fresh bids for implementing the Revamped Pradhan Mantri Fasal Bima Yojana adopting Co-insurance model of 80:20 for the year 2021-2022 stipulating certain conditions.
- 12. Accordingly, the Director of Agriculture in his letter dated 3.8.2021, requested the Government to issue orders for cancellation of tender called for on 02.07.2021 and inform the L1 bidders about the cancellation besides permitting to call for a short fresh e-bid from the empanelled Insurance Companies for implementation of Revamped Pradhan Mantri Fasal Bima Yojana (RPMFBY) during 2021-2022 adopting the Co-insurance model of 80:20 proportionate sharing basis.
- 13. In Government letter dated 03.08.2021, the Government issued orders to cancel the tender invited on 02.07.2021 and call for a short fresh e-bids to implement Revamped Pradhan Mantri Fasal Bima Yojana (RPMFBY) during 2021-2022 by adopting the co-insurance model of 80:20 proportionate sharing basis for selection of Insurance Companies from the empanelled list of Government of India.
- 14. Accordingly, the Director of Agriculture in the letter dated 12.8.2021, has sent the proposal to Government for approval of the Actuarial Premium Rates (APRs) quoted by the selected Insurance Companies and permission to issue work orders to L1 Insurance Companies for the e-bids opened on 10.08.2021. Out of the 18 empanelled Insurance Companies, Agriculture Insurance Company of India Limited (AICIL) and IFFCO TOKIO General Insurance Company Limited (IFFCO TOKIO GIC) alone submitted their bids. 15. The Tender Finalization & Accepting Committee compared the weighted average of the companies and declared the following company / companies as L1 for cluster. The details of L1 for each cluster for implementation of Revamped Pradhan Mantri Fasal Bima Yojana by adopting 80:20 Co-insurance model on Proportionate sharing basis during 2021-2022 is as follows:-

- 16. The Tender Finalization & Accepting Committee issued the following orders:
  - (i). Agriculture Insurance Company of India Limited (AICIL) was declared as L1 for 12 clusters viz., Cluster II,IV,V,VI,VII,VIII,IX,X,XI,XII,XIII & XIV. However as Agriculture Insurance Company of India Limited (AICIL) alone had bidded for Clusters XIII & XIV, the company was declared as L1 considering the following facts:
    - i. AICIL is a Public Sector Undertaking which is in the field of Agriculture Insurance for more than 30 years.

ii. AlCIL is implementing Crop Insurance Schemes in Tamil Nadu from 2000 onwards.

- iii. AlCIL is the nodal agency for Government of India in implementing PMFBY.
- iv. AICIL has unblemished records in implementation of this scheme in Tamil Nadu.

## (ii). IFFCO TOKIO General Insurance Company Limited was declared as L1 for Cluster I & III.

- 17. As such, an amount of Rs.1,738.81 crore (Agriculture: Rs.1715.42 crore; Horticulture: Rs.24.43 crore) has been allocated in Budget Estimate 2021-2022 out of which an amount of Rs.1,724.14 crore (Agriculture: Rs.1,700.000 crore; Horticulture: Rs.24.14 crore) has been allocated for settlement of state share of premium subsidy. However, an amount of Rs.1,616 crore (Agriculture: Rs.1,600.000 crore; Horticulture: Rs.16.00 crore) alone is expected to be utilized for settlement of balance premium subsidy for Special and Rabi seasons of 2020-2021.
- 18. As per the tender for implementation of Revamped Pradhan Mantri Fasal Bima Yojana (RPMFBY) during 2021-2022 by adopting Coinsurance Model on 80:20 proportionate sharing basis, the expected State share of premium subsidy will be around Rs.1,923 crore (Agriculture: Rs.1,886 crore; Horticulture: Rs.37 crore) out of which an amount of Rs.697 crore (Agriculture:Rs.674 crore; Horticulture: Rs.23 crore) will be required to settle the entire premium subsidy for Kharif,2021 and upfront subsidy for Special and Rabi seasons of 2021-2022.
- 19. Since a sum of Rs.108.00 crore is expected as savings in the budget allocation of 2021-2022, an additional amount of Rs.589 crore (Agriculture:Rs.574 crore; Horticulture: Rs.15 crore) alone is required to settle the entire premium subsidy for Kharif,2021 and upfront subsidy for Special and Rabi seasons of 2021-2022.
- 20. The Director of Agriculture has, therefore, requested the Government to issue the following orders:-
  - 1. Approve the district-wise, crop-wise Actuarial Premium Rates quoted by the selected Insurance Companies.
  - 2. Approve the Cluster-wise Implementing Agencies selected by the Chairman of Tender finalising Committee / Director of Agriculture as per the Tamil Nadu Transparency in Tender Act, 1998 and Tamil Nadu Transparency in Tender Rules 2000 and Rules 2012.
  - 3. Permission to issue work orders for 2021-2022 to:
    - a. Agriculture Insurance Company of India Limited (AICIL) for 12 clusters viz., Clusters II,IV,V,VI,VII,VIII, IX,X,XI, XII,XIII & XIV and to implement the conditions stipulated by AICIL as per the provisions in the Operational Guidelines and approval of State Level Coordination Committee for Crop Insurance (SLCCCI).
    - b. IFFCO TOKIO General Insurance Company Limited for Clusters I and III.
  - 4. Permit the Director of Agriculture / Director of Horticulture & Plantation crops to notify the Kharif crops for which the enrolment window is open and all crops during Special and Rabi seasons of 2021-2022 in concurrence with SLCCCI meeting.

- 5. To bear 80% of the Administrative Cost which includes Bank Service Charges, Intermediary / Business Procurement charges, Publicity Expenses and Claim Management Expenses subject to an overall ceiling of 1.6% of the Gross Premium receivable by the Insurance Company.
- 6. Provide necessary budget of Rs.589 crore (Agriculture: Rs.574 crore; Horticulture: Rs.15 crore) alone to settle the entire state share of premium subsidy for Kharif,2021 and upfront subsidy for Special and Rabi seasons of 2021-2022 in addition to the amount of Rs.1,738.81 crore (Agriculture: Rs.1715.42 crore; Horticulture: Rs.24.43 crore) allotted in BE 2021-2022.
- 21. The Government after careful examination of the proposal of the Director of Agriculture hereby issue orders as follows:
  - i. To approve the District-wise, crop-wise Actuarial Premium Rates quotes by the selected Insurance Companies.
  - ii. To approve the Cluster-wise Implementing Agencies selected by the Chairman of Tender Finalizing Committee / Director of Agriculture as per the Tamil Nadu Transparency in Tender Act, 1998 and Tamil Nadu Transparency in Tender Rules 2000 and Rules 2012.
  - iii. To permit to issue work orders for 2021-2022 to:-

    - b) IFFCO TOKIO General Insurance Company Limited for Clusters I & III.
  - iv. To permit the Director of Agriculture / Director of Horticulture and Plantation Crops to notify the Kharif crops for which the enrolment window is open and all crops during Special and Rabi seasons of 2021-2022 in concurrence with SLCCCI meeting.
  - v. To bear 80% of the Administrative Cost which includes Bank Service Charges, Intermediary / Business Procurement charges, Publicity Expenses and Claim Management Expenses subject to an overall ceiling of 1.6% of the Gross Premium receivable by the Insurance Company.
  - vi. To provide necessary budget of Rs.589 crore (Agriculture: Rs.574.00 crore; Horticulture: Rs.15.00 crore) alone to settle the entire state share of premium subsidy for Kharif, 2021 and upfront subsidy for Special and Rabi seasons of 2021-2022 in addition to the amount of Rs.1,738.81 crore (Agriculture: Rs.1715.42 crore; Horticulture: Rs.24.43 crore) allotted in Revised Budget Estimate 2021-2022.
- 22. The Government direct the Director of Agriculture and the Director of Horticulture and Plantation Crops to carry out Crop Cutting Experiments very carefully and correctly avoiding any moral hazards. The Director of Agriculture and Director of Horticulture and Plantation Crops may be monitored closely both by the

Agriculture Department and Commissioner of Economics and Statistics to ensure accuracy and reliability and to verify the area coverage by farmers carefully, particularly in the tail end districts thereby minimizing claims for early season crop losses.
